SOCIAL STUDIES LICENSURE, GRADES 7-12

(All course requirements are subject to change. Students must meet current state requirements at time of application for graduation)

Licensure for teaching requires completion of the bachelor's degree in Fulbright College and completion of the Master of Arts in Teaching (M.A.T.) degree through the College of Education and Health Professions. Admission to the M.A.T. program requires admission to the Graduate School. Refer to the Graduate School for the GPA requirements. 1. Complete BA degree in Anthropology, Economics, History, Geography, Political Science, Psychology, or Sociology
2. Complete the following with a grade of "C" or higher:
 - Computer competencies will be demonstrated by candidate in a portfolio or by taking ETEC 2001/2002L-Educational Technology and Educational Technology Lab or another appropriately approved course.
 - CIED 4131-Practicum in Secondary Education. It is preferred that you take this class no later than Fall semester of your senior year.
 - CIED 4023-Teaching in Inclusive Secondary Setting or CIED 3023-Survey of Exceptionalities. Secondary Education majors should take CIED 4023 instead of CIED 3023.
3. Additional course requirements:
 - ECON 2143 or any other 3 credit ECON class
 - HIST 4583-Arkansas and the Nation or HIST 3383-Arkansas and the Southwest.
